

STOP

Stop immediately and as close to the location of the accident as possible. The law requires it.

ASSIST THE INJURED

1. Check for injured persons.
2. If necessary, call 911 or an ambulance, whichever is quicker.
3. Do NOT move the injured person.

PROTECT THE SCENE

Warn approaching vehicles with emergency flashers, flares, reflectors, or even a flashlight.

CALL AN OFFICER

Notify the police or county or state law enforcement at once. This is the law, and the official report may be helpful later.

COMMENTS

Do not comment on the accident. Keep notes and information to yourself. Admit nothing and sign nothing; never volunteer information.

ASSIST THE OFFICER

Remain at the scene until officer arrives. Cooperate by advising officer

of the basic facts. No one can force you to give an opinion. Any statement you make may be used as an admission. You have the right to consult a lawyer as soon as possible.

IDENTIFY OTHER DRIVER

Obtain the other driver's name, address, and vehicle registration number. Ask to see his driver's license. Note the number.

WITNESSES

Obtain names and addresses of any and all witnesses. Ask witnesses to sign a statement concerning the accident. (Keep a pen and pad handy)

FILL OUT FORMS (BACK)

Make your own notes on all significant circumstances. Step off exact distances of skid marks and other important distances. Be certain that you can later point out where vehicles collided and where they stopped. If possible, take pictures to preserve skid marks, position of cars and other physical evidence that will disappear. Fill out the accident information form and diagram in folder.

ARRESTS

Arrest of you or the other party does not necessarily indicate liability. It is not ordinarily used in a damage suit.

WHEN TO LEAVE SCENE

Unless injuries impel you to do otherwise, do not leave the scene of the accident until you have completed the previously outlined procedures.

SEE A CHIROPRACTOR
